Palm-Passion Sunday

Hosanna ! Hosanna ! Blessings on Jesus our King !

This weekend, we celebrate **Palm Sunday** and enter into the celebration of the solemn memorial of the Passion of Jesus Christ singing our *"Hosanna ! Hosanna to the Son* of David !". We symbolically enter Jerusalem, which is the key image and metaphor of all that will happen during these, the Church's high holy days. The Temple is the place of Sacrifice. Jesus is the Lamb of the New Covenant. He is the sacrificial gift that celebrates reconciliation and a new communion with God.

From the celebration of the *Scrutinies* over these past three Sundays, we know that Jesus is the *Living Water, the Light of the World, the Resurrection and Life*. Today we celebrate him as Son of David, our Lord and King, in Whom the love of God is made real. Following Jesus' example, we are all asked to accept and join in His mission, and

empty ourselves in service to God and God's kingdom of people.

J²alm Sunday is both an ending and a beginning: it is the culmination of our Lenten Season, and the beginning of our Holy Week. We look toward the heart of our faith in the celebration of the Holy Triduum – *the Paschal Mystery of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus the Christ.*

I he Passion of Jesus calls our attention to some of the mystery of this event. God's plan of salvation is fulfilled through the great act of sacrificial love of Jesus Christ our Lord. As we listen attentively to the proclamation of the Gospel Passion Reading of Jesus' life and death, the Gospel tells us of the betrayals of His friends, Jesus' expressions of knowledge and wisdom, His agony in the garden, His prophecying, the accusations, tauntings and scourging laid upon Him. Sometimes, we, too, go along with the crowd, along with society's dictation, and our joyous "Hosannas!"



turn to "Crucify him! Crucify him !" In His infinite love for each and everyone of us, Jesus freely and willingly gives His life for ours, and is crucified on the cross, a

ours, and is crucified on the cross, a vicious and painful capital punishment.

The search for the meaning of the death of Jesus has occupied the Christian consciousness since the event took place. How could such a thing have happened? Why did God plan it this way, and allow it to happen? How does the mystery of God's plan have meaning for our lives now?

We know though, through God's Word, and the gift and grace of faith, the immense joy that results from this cruel event. Jesus rose from the dead, and conquered death forever, and for all. We recollect the suffering of Jesus, but we need not despair. Our hope of salvation is guaranteed, is indeed promised, through Jesus' great sacrifice, mercy, and deep, everlasting love.

Holy Week & The Sacred Tríduum

The Roman Catholic Church's Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum (pronounced **Tri-doo-umm**) will begin after our solemn commemoration and remembrance on this Palm-Passion Sunday. The Triduum - the days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil - is considered one holy liturgical celebration. We are all encouraged to participate on all three days.

May God's Word on this day, and throughout the journey of this coming Holy Week, speak directly to the depths of our hearts and souls. May we keep this week holy with quiet prayer, meditation and contemplation, so that we may truly give God our humble hearts filled with sincere thanks and praise. We continue our journey each day as Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year 2025. We ask you, O Lord, open our hearts to offer You thanks and praise with repentance, humility and sincerity. You passionately endured suffering and death to show us the depth of Your love for us, and generously gift us with salvation. Strengthen us, and give us the courage to always reject evil, and lead us away from all temptation.

We gather solemnly on this Palm Sunday to commemorate humbly and gratefully the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. As in past years, please gather in the Gym to begin with the proclamation of the first Gospel, followed by our procession outside (weather permitting) singing our joyous Hosannas, and entering into the church through the front doors. (Parishioners & Friends with health issues or limited mobility may certainly go directly into the church.)



FIRST READING (Isaiah 50:4-7) ~ 'I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. I know that I shall not be put to shame."

SECOND READING (*Philippians 2:6-11*) ~ Jesus humbled himself. Therefore God highly exalted him.

GOSPEL (Luke 23:1-49) ~ The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ.

O Lord Jesus Christ, the Messiah of all, may we allow our lives to be transformed by the generous and infinite grace of God raising us to new life through the wondrous mystery of Your Paschal mystery.

O Lord, heal us. O Lord, heal us. Jesus Savior of the world. Jesus bore our sins in his own body on the cross, so that dead to sin, we might live for righteousness. By Jesus' wounds, we have been healed. (1 Peter 2)



When we chose and accepted our piece of palm branch today, we promised to live as pilgrims, to move through this life with, and in Jesus our Lord. Like the Israelites in the desert, we are only passing through. Like Christ himself, we go about carrying good news, even when we walk the way of tears.... We are indeed Beloved !

+ Holy Thursday - Mass of the Lord's Supper **Apr. 17th at 7:00pm** ~ For Pope Francis, Archbishop

Le Gatt, for our Pastor Fr. Chrys & all the Clergy. ~ "We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life, and our resurrection; through him we are saved and made free." The Liturgy of the Sacred Triduum opens with this verse on Holy Thursday, which sets the tone for the next three days. We are drawn into the Paschal mystery on this evening by listening to God's Holy Word. We then reenact:

+ The Washing of Feet ~ The command in the Gospel to serve is shown by the loving actions of Jesus as he humbled himself by becoming the servant and washed the feet of his disciples ("Mandatum") - "I have given you the example,



that you also should do as I have done to you." John 13:15) Twelve CTK Parishioners will come forward to have their feet washed in commemoration of this commission, which is given to all the Baptized.



+ *Eucharist*: The Liturgy continues with the 🚻 Last Supper, which we celebrate each time we gather for Mass to share the Word and the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ.

+ Procession & Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament ~ After sharing at the table of Eucharist, we will follow in procession downstairs to Lennox Hall. Everyone is invited to stay a while in prayer and adoration right after the Mass; or if you prefer, you may go home and come back a little later, entering at the parking lot doors. Adoration will continue until 12 midnight. ...continued...

+ Good Fríday Servíce The Passion of the Lord Jesus Apr. 18th at 3:00pm ~ For needs & intentions of all Parishioners.

~ On Good Friday, and if possible on Holy Saturday, we are called to fast, refrain from snacking, and focus on that aspect of our faith which sees Christ as the ultimate source of our nourishment.

+ Proclamation of the Word ~ The celebration of the Lord's Passion begins in silence to indicate that this is a continuation of the Paschal celebration which began on Holy Thursday. The Presider falls prostrate before the veiled Cross and all pray in silence. The Scriptures proclaimed today give an even more profound understanding of the ritual of service we celebrated last evening, with the agony in the garden, the betrayal by Judas, the abandoning by the disciples, the painful journey to the Cross ...

+ Universal Intercessions ~ On this Solemn day, we join the whole Church throughout the world in praying the Universal Intercessions ("Prayers of the Faithful"), which will be sung today. As we commemorate Jesus' self-giving, our prayer of petition and intercession is especially significant.

~ On this central day of our Paschal celebration, we fall in adoration to the Cross of Christ Jesus which has won for us salvation. This is the one true Cross through which all are saved. The central action of the Holy Triduum is the veneration of the Cross which establishes our eternal Passover from sin to salvation, from death to life.

~ If you wish, and are comfortable, you are invited to remove your footwear as you come forward to venerate the Cross.




participate in this night's liturgy. Though the Easter Vigil is a long liturgy, it flows very smoothly, unfolding in four distinct parts.

- 1. Liturgy of the Word 3. Liturgy of Baptism
- 2. Liturgy of the Light 4. Liturgy of Eucharist

Through its progression, the Vigil immerses us deeper and deeper into the Paschal Mystery of Christ. We hear the magnificent story of salvation history of the whole world's salvation and light the new fire and candles, which literally chases the darkness away. We experience the risen Christ in our midst, raising our voices in the singing of Al ias! We participate in the saving waters of Baptism and share in the table of Eucharist. The beauty of this special liturgy exhilarates and fills us with renewed faith and hope in God's saving promises.

A reception for all will be held downstairs in Lennox Hall right after the celebration of the most holy Easter Vigil.
