The Resurrection of the Lord Jesus

April 20th, 2025.

Jesus is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Alleluía! Alleluía! Alleluía! On this Easter morning, the tomb is empty! The resurrection of Jesus is the centre of our Christian faith, and through His ultimate act of self-sacrifice, the Lord Jesus has conquered death. It is finished," Jesus said from the Cross on Good Friday. He has fulfilled the will of God, ensuring salvation for all who believe in

We continue our journey each day as Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year 2025. FIRST READING (Acts 10:34a,37-43) ~ In the home of Cornelius, a devout Roman centurion, Peter shares, with all those gathered, the Good News of the life of the Lord Jesus, from his anointing at his Baptism by John, and his good works of healing, to his death and resurrection. Peter assures both the Jewish people and the Gentiles that if they believe in the risen Christ and bear witness to him, they will gain new life.

<u>SECOND READING</u> (Colossians 3: 1-4) ~ Paul encourages his listeners to set their minds on things that are above, not on things that are on this earth, reminding them to die to earthly

things and live in and for Christ.

GOSPEL (John 20:1-18) ~ In her grief, Mary Magdalene goes to the place where Jesus' body was laid, expecting to find the remains of death in the cold tomb. Instead she finds the stone rolled away, and runs to tell the disciples. Peter and John quickly go to the tomb, and find it



empty. Mary encounters the 'gardener', who says Mary's name, and at once, she recognizes him as the Risen Lord, and reaches out to him. The disciples remember the teaching of Scripture that he must rise from the dead. This revelation leads to their faith in the resurrection of Jesus.

In the Easter Season, the most common type of treat is the Easter egg. The egg is seen as a symbol of Jesus' tomb: It is enclosed, quiet, and it seems lifeless. Yet within an egg, the wondrous mystery and promise of new life is waiting to burst forth.

Jesus' tomb was like an egg until early on Easter, when Jesus rose up to a new and glorious life. Because of this rich symbolism, many cultures add beautiful decorations to eggs in celebration of Easter time.
