



A Jubilee Year - Pilgrims of Hope December 24th, 2024 to January 26th, 2026 Rediscovering Our Need for Daily Prayer

A Jubilee Year occurs every 25 years in the Catholic Church. In this year of 2025, we are celebrating the Jubilee "Pilgrims of Hope"!

The Holy Father, Pope Francis inaugurated this Jubilee Year on Christmas Eve, December 24th, 2024, with the solemn opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's





All the Faithful are invited to enter into and live this Jubilee Year as "Pilgrims of Hope", nurturing a spiritual experience that enriches the life of the Church. As Christians who believe with faith in God, we are encouraged to make *prayer* the foundation of our life. As individuals, as community, and as people of every nation of the world, let us make opportunities, and exercise the privilege to rediscover the absolute need for daily prayer, and meditation with God's holy Word.

You will find *prayer cards* in your pews with the printed *Jubilee* **Prayer 2025**, and the words for the Hymn for the Jubilee Year on the reverse. As a faith family, in unity with the whole Church around the world, let us fervently pray this prayer together during Mass, immediately after the Prayers of the Faithful. May the prayer of the Church reinvigorate and leave its grace within the heart of every Christian, and inspire the faith of every person.

May we walk each day as Jesus' Pilgrims of Hope, helping and inspiring others to hope and come to believe in the promises and salvation of our gracious and loving Lord God.

On this third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we celebrate our unity as one body in Jesus Christ our Lord, and live actively our privilege to be a part of his mission of love.

FIRST READING (Nehemiah 8:2-4a,5-6,8-10++) \sim Ezra explains to the people that God's law does not forbid them from enjoying good things in life, but rather, invites them to enter into a renewal of life with justice, equality and peace, sharing generously for the common good, without the expectation of anything in return.

<u>SECOND READING</u> (1Corinthians 12:12-4,27) \sim Paul uses the analogy of the human body to illustrate that it takes many parts to form one body. And so it is with Christ's body. It takes many members – baptized into one body of Christ, and drinking of one Spirit. All people are called to nourish and nurture the body of Christ by each person generously sharing their unique giftedness for the common good, and to welcome all into the Body.



GOSPEL (Luke 1:1-4,4:14-21) ~ Jesus, filled with Holy Spirit, returns to Galilee to teach in their synagogues. He then travels to Nazareth and goes to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He is given the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah, and proclaims the scripture which

speaks about himself. He reveals to those gathered that "Today, this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing!"

The Spirit of the Lord is upon us. We too, anointed at our Baptism, are called:

- + to bring good news to the poor
- + to proclaim release to captives
- + to proclaim recovery of sight to the blind
- + to help bring freedom the oppressed
- + to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor

Today, this Scripture has been fulfilled in our hearing. May we be open to believing in this grace, and live our baptismal privilege with courage each day.

Puring Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the fullness of the mystery of the Lord Jesus. The people of God offer praise by commemorating and celebrating the Paschal Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

On the first day of the week, the Lord's Day, God assembles the beloved People to hear the Word, to reflect upon it, to offer the living sacrifice of praise, and to eat and drink the banquet of the Lord. Then God sends them forth to proclaim this love by their words and actions.

Sunday is the original Christian Feast Day, following the tradition handed down from Apostolic times, for this was the day of the Lord's Resurrection. Today's Christian communities continue this tradition by celebrating every Sunday as the day of the risen Lord.

Special Blessing of CANDLES \sim Next Sunday, February 2^{nd} is the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, also known as "Candlemas" which marks the return of light, a symbol of protection and prosperity. This Christian festival commemorates the presentation of Jesus by Blessed Mary and Saint Joseph in the Temple of Jerusalem, referring to him as the light of the people of Israel, and of the world. Blessed candles can be used both for votive purposes (to present a prayerful intention before God), and

when praying, particularly at the time of a loved one's

impending death.

World Day for Consecrated Life - Next Sunday, February 2nd, the Church also celebrates the World Day for Consecrated Life – a celebration of those who have received and accepted the invitation to live in the freedom of a celibate, vowed life. Saint Pope John Paul II (1997), said: "The purpose of the day is "to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels" as well as "to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervour which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord."
