We are reminded that God the Father unconditionally loves each of us, even with our human imperfections and sinfulness. We are encouraged by grace to strive to be a reflection of Abba's perfect love, understanding and mercy, extending the same compassionate actions to everyone we encounter throughout our daily lives.

First Reading (Isaiah 35:4-7) ~ Isaiah prophesies that the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unstopped, and tongues of the speechless loosened.

Second Reading (James 2:1-5) ~ God has chosen the poor in spirit to be rich in faith, and heirs of the kingdom. Therefore, make no distinctions or negative criticisms or judgements, nor show favoritism to the wealthy and the attractive, but rather, welcome everyone with open arms and gentle hearts.

Gospel (Mark 7:31-37) ~ Jesus fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah through His most merciful actions of compassion. The man who was deaf was brought forward to Jesus. He touches the



man's ears and tongue, and then looking up to heaven, Jesus says, "Ephphatha," which means opened." Jesus orders the people to secrecy about his healing works, but they are so amazed and hope-filled, they cannot help but spread the word of his miracles.

Tesus does everything well, all the time. In today's Gospel, he communicates with someone who cannot hear, and it amazes and astounds the crowd. In other cases, before He performs a miracle, Jesus talks to the person for whom the miracle will be done, asking the person what it is they need.

In this situation, the individual cannot hear, so Jesus uses body language and signs.

Jesus' healing begins by letting the Man who is deaf know that He is putting a part of himself into the deaf Man - his fingers into the Man's ears, his spittle into his mouth. By this means, Jesus



invites the Man to accept Jesus into himself – literally.

And then Jesus looks up to heaven to show the Man the source of Jesus' power. It doesn't come from some magic in Jesus' fingers or spittle. It comes from God, whose power is in Jesus, and who is now in the healed Man, by means of these signs. ~ Adapted from Eleanore Stump, Center for Liturgy

Examination of our Selves: lacktriangle Do we do things well, as people were saying about Jesus? Do we do everything to the best of our ability? What obstructs our hearing? How, or why are we closed off ... by prejudices, entitlement, arrogance, unforgiveness, betrayal...? What shuts us down, hinders us, and causes us to not want to hear or listen? Why do we sometimes negatively criticize instead of building up? Jealousy? Why do we not strive to take steps to seek reconciliation? Let us hear Jesus' word: Ephphatha!
