Seasons of Advent

The Season of Advent can speak to each heart . . .

Advent is a season of Faith. Fear and doubt often get in the way of accepting God's grace, healing and wholeness. Only a renewal of faith can bring us home.

It is a season of Hope. God does not leave us without comfort and support. Hope is a faithful virtue that empowers us to face the future with courage and faith, determination, strength and peace.

Advent is a season of Love. The light of Love comes to our hearts to counter the darkness and anxieties of life. It is the Lord's love for us that has made us loveable!

It is a season of compassion. Our burdens are embraced by God's compassionate heart. When we attempt to soothe hearts from breaking... when we offer comfort to those in pain... as we console those who mourn... when we feed the hungry... as we express reverence toward all of God's creation ... God lifts our burdens, and works through us to lift the burdens of others.

Advent is a season of watchfulness. By asking and clinging to God's graceful Holy Spirit, we keep our senses keen to the signs in the world that we are called to respond and act upon.

This weekend is the beginning of our beautiful, sacred Season of Advent as we celebrate today the First of four Sundays of Advent! May our gracious God touch our waiting and expectant hearts with hope and joy!

First Reading (Jeremiah 33:14-16). The Lord promises hope to a dispirited nation. A branch of righteousness will come to God's people through the line of David.

Second Reading (1Thess. 3:12-4:2). As Paul and his community in Thessalonica prepare for the Lord's coming, he urges them to concentrate on the only value that matters: Love. In this way, they will be living the kind of life that pleases the Lord, and brings glory to God.

Gospel (*Luke 21:25-28, 34-36*). Jesus tells his disciples that there will be signs in the heavens and on earth that



will cause fear and distress to many people. Jesus encourages his people, that when faced with the fear of uncertainty, worries, and weighed down hearts, the sure way to gain confidence is to be alert, be on guard, be ready, have faith and stand strong, for redemption is drawing near.

As we begin our Advent journey toward the Feast of the Nativity of the Lord Jesus, we are called and urged be open in heart and mind, and keep our focus on our Lord... to be on guard... to stay awake... stay alert at all times and be ready. Life is full of evil and temptations, revenge, arrogance, and trials. But be confident, full of Holy Spirit's love, hope, joy, peace and faith. Be not afraid! Pray for strength. Trust in the Lord's redemption, which is drawing near. Which ever way we individually need to hear Jesus' message, may we all use wisely and effectively this waiting time of Advent to choose to prepare a sacred place within our stablehearts for Jesus Christ to be born, dwell, and inspire!
