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# First Sunday of Lent March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

### Our Journey in Lent

In order for us to faithfully and righteously live this Season of Lent, we have to remember: Lent isn't about just 'givingsomething-up for 40 days', or 'not-doing-something-for-this-6-

weeks', or 'sacrificing something for the days of the Lenten Season'... and then once Easter comes, we can go back to our previous habits. That's not the point of Lent. The journey of the liturgical Season of Lent is about conversion, a journey along which we are all called to specifically scrutinize or examine our way of life as a disciple of Christ, and

where we need to allow God into our lives to change our heart, attitudes, and actions. (We can choose to do this on any day, at any time during the year, too.)

On this First Sunday of Lent, we begin this yearly journey of soul-searching and conversion by deepening our relationship with Jesus. We offer to God the disciplines ('root word: *disciple*) of penance (*'prayer, fasting, almsgiving'*, our *'acts of service and charity'*) because we love God. The Lord calls us to pray in a new and more devoted way... to think in a new and more discerning way... to act in a new and more compassionate way... to see things in a new and more generous way... to speak to one another in a new and gentler way... to listen and be more patient and understanding in a new and more loving way...

Our Lenten songs and psalms have a theme: "Create in me a clean heart, O God", and "Have mercy, Lord, cleanse me from all my sin." Save your people, O Lord." Whether we know if or not, our hearts yearn and thirst and long to be more intimately united and at one with the Divine; to be healed, to be at peace, to be made whole. And it is only in God's mercy, grace, and great love through Christ Jesus, with the power of Holy Spirit that we can ever be transformed and created



anew. We have to be willing to invite the Lord God into our hearts, and willing allow God permission to change us.

+ May we desire to make our **prayer** time with the Lord Jesus a daily routine that deepens and heals our relationship with God, a

prayer-practice that we hopefully commit to each day...and for the rest of our lives.

+ We are called to fast, but that doesn't mean to starve or neglect ourselves. We must take care of our temple bodies, a gift created and given by God. As we abstain and empty ourselves by fasting from food, treats, and overindulgence, may our hungers and cravings be filled and satisfied by humbly receiving and accepting the

Lord's grace. May we make the commitment to our fast by repenting (turning back) to God, choosing to become more mindful and attentive throughout our whole day...and for the rest of our lives.

+ May we graciously receive the strength to continue the almsgiving of our time, talent, and treasure more generously and consciously throughout each day... for the rest of our lives...

Let us unite together in our Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving, being thought-full and supportive of one another as we join ourselves through, with, and in God.

#### As Pilgrims of Hope journeying in this Jubilee

**Year 2025,** may we repent and allow the Lord to walk with us in the wilderness of the dry lenten desert. We cannot live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. May we worship the Lord our God, and serve only God. With our hearts full of humility and repentance. O



Lord, give us the grace to never put you to the test. Strengthen and give us the courage to always reject evil, and lead us away from all temptation.

Thank you All for uniting your voices together to pray the special Jubilee prayer, found in your pews. God is Good !

The Church's liturgical Lenten Journey has begun, and we are called to empty ourselves, making a sacred space for the wisdom, grace and healing of God to live within us along our life's journey. Like Jesus, ours is a journey through a dry desert. We wait in active expectation and awareness through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. May we allow God's Spirit to breathe in us and "shake the sand and dust" from our hearts, cleansing and renewing us with Love.

<u>**FIRST READING**</u> (Deuteronomy 26:4-10) ~ Past events of God's salvation are celebrated in the liturgical action of bringing the first fruits of the earth to the altar. Hope for the future is based on the loving fidelity of the God of all.

<u>SECOND READING</u> (*Romans 10:8-13*)  $\sim$  The content of faith is the fact that Jesus is Lord in virtue of his resurrection from the dead.

<u>**GOSPEL**</u> (*Luke 4:1-13*) ~ As Jesus prepares for his public ministry he faces temptation and trials suggested insidiously



by the evil one in the dry desert. Jesus has lived and experienced humanity, and so, knows our weaknesses.

During his 40 days in the dry desert, Jesus faced various temptations and trials. On this First Sunday of Lent, we

hear three of the temptations of the evil one:

As his hungry body craved food, Jesus rejected the temptation to command a stone to become a loaf of bread. By his example, He taught us poorness in spirit: ("One cannot live on bread alone...."). We were created by God, and God knows our needs. We require nourishment in both body and spirit: food/water, and a faithful dependence on every holy word that God shares with us.

As Jesus prepared for his public ministry, he experienced the temptation of the human ego to possess glory and power in a worldly way, offered by the evil one (*"To you, I will give...*). Jesus taught us humility by rejecting the temptation to gain power and glory. He instead chose to give his life in service by preaching, teaching and loving his people.

And Jesus rejected the temptation of the evil one to put God to the test; to see if God would send his Angels to protect him. Jesus, in his divinity, already knows the love of the Trinity. In his humanity, Jesus teaches us to have faith and trust that God is God, and to worship God alone.

Lenten Penance -Practices-Disciplines



+ **Prayer** ~ Let us commit to a routine of prayer, allowing the Lord to feed our Spirits and strengthen our relationship in love.

+ Fasting ~ May we choose mindfully to limit our food and drink, snacks and treats, emptying ourselves to be filled with the healing, goodness and wisdom of the Lord God.

+ Almsgiving ~ Let us give generously of our time, talent, and treasure to benefit others, without expecting anything in return.

**Meaning of Abstinence** ~ Abstinence is understood to mean "not eating meat" (usually on Fridays). Depending on your particular food intake/diet, Catholics may also substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting and abstinence from meat. The law of "<u>abstinence from meat</u>" is strongly encouraged for those who are 14 yrs. and older. (We can all do without meat for one day, at least). The law of <u>'fasting</u>' is strongly encouraged for those from 18-59 years of age. (Those with serious health issues are urged to choose their fast wisely.)The faithful actions modeled by adults will be the greatest influence in the faith of children. (Ordo, Lit. Calendar)
